To advance sociological knowledge and to present his literary work, Dr. Riaz Ahmed Shaikh, Associate Professor / Rector, Biztek participated in XVII ISA World Congress of Sociology, Gothenburg, Sweden, from 11th to 17th July, 2010. Dr. Riaz Shaikh presented his paper in Academic session RC01 session no. 2, 3 & 4. The topics of his papers were

The research paper was entitled: Pakistani Military Role in Asian Context, in Giuseppe Caforio (ed), Advances in Military Sociology: Essays in Honor of Charles C. Moskos, ISBN: 978-1-84855-892-2, Emerald Group Publishing Limited, United Kingdom, 2009. For the first time this year Emerald launched awards for books as part of the Emerald Literati Network Awards for Excellence 2010 and it was here that the award was conferred upon our Rector.

US SHOULD BE MORE EVEN-HANDED IN SOUTH ASIA

Biztek organized a seminar on 'US Pakistan relations and situation in Afghanistan' at Avari Towers on 14th June 2010. The eminent guest speakers included former foreign secretary Riaz Hussain Khokar, Dr. Steven R. Ekovich, professor of International & Comparative politics at the American University of Paris and Former ambassador Mehdi Masood.



Though partners in the war against militancy in the region, the relationship between the United States and Pakistan is not even-handed and there are several long-term issues where both nations differ greatly.

Former foreign secretary Riaz Hussain Khokar said this here on Monday while addressing a seminar titled 'US Pakistan relations and situation in Afghanistan'. Speaking via video link from Islamabad, Mr. Khokar described the Pakistani-American relationship as 'very mixed', saying that there were phases where there was enormous difference of opinion on key issues, while there were also positive elements to the relationship such as the nearly million strong Pakistan-American community, which the former diplomat described as playing 'an important role' in bringing the two countries together.

He said the military pacts signed with the Americans in the 1950s such as SEATO/CENTO were not very beneficial to Pakistan while the country felt let down by the US in its wars with India of 1965 and 1971. "People are skeptical about the current relationship. They feel it is contractual. It is an inherently unequal relationship as the US is the world's sole superpower. We understand that. But Pakistan has suffered a lot since the war theatre has shifted [here]".

Mr. Khokar said there was major dislocation in Pakistan while the country was going through a huge financial crisis. "I would not blame the US, we are responsible. But US and other countries should come forward with more economic assistance".

There were many issues dealt regarding Pakistan's struggle with various economic elements. This seminar however, was a great prestige for Biztek and provide a platform to hype up its name amongst other well know universities. This seminar gave it a great exposure and the audience was enlightened upon the topic at discussion. We proudly can claim that we participate actively in regards of important and recent news concerning our economy, social and political circumstances. We can address at a global perspective and actively involve students who keenly are interested in global and local happenings.

Mr. Khokar continued by approaching the issues where there are likely to be differences







between Washington and Islamabad. Riaz Khokar said Pakistan was not comfortable with the US encouraging India to play a greater role in the region, specifically Afghanistan, especially if this "strategic space" was used against this country's interests.

He added that while Pakistan enjoyed exemplary relations with China, there was a view that American foreign policy in Asia was designed to "contain" the People's Republic, while India was being promoted as a countervail against China. The former senior diplomat observed that Pakistan would in no way support any efforts to isolate Beijing. "Pakistan has excellent relations with Iran. We cannot be part of any policy to contain Iran," he added, referring to another American nemesis in the region.

Dr. Steven R. Ekovich, professor of international and comparative politics at the American University of Paris, spoke earlier. Dr Ekovich said it would be unfair to judge Barack Obama's foreign policy after only a year in power. He observed that Mr. Obama was skilled at deploying political symbols. "Much of the foreign policy is symbolic rather than substantive." However, the professor said there has been a substantive change in US-Pakistan policy ever since Mr. Obama moved into the White House. He cited the strategic change in US-Washington and Islamabad as well as the increased visits of high-ranking officials. "Pakistan is seen as critically important to the US. It is seen as a front-line country in the struggle against violent extremisim", a term, he said which had been favored by the American administration as opposed to the war on terror.



Dr. Ekovich said the Obama administration doesn't want to equate any religion with terrorism, adding that there had been a "change in terminology" when referring to the Muslim world.

Coming to the tricky issue of aid, the scholar said that three quarters of US aid to Pakistan was military aid, but now there had been a "reorientation of that aid" with a focus on counter-insurgency training for the Pakistani armed forces. But with the Kerry-Lugar bull, he said there was a significant increase in the amount of aid for civil society. "A hopeless polulation becomes vulnerable to terrorism. Poverty and hopelessness provide fertile terrain for terrorism, but are not its causes".

Former ambassador Mehdi Masood said that without "Pakistanis intercession" the peace in Afghanistan would not move forward very easily. He added that if this nation wanted to ensure its sovereinity, it should put its own house in order.

In conclusion to this phenomenal and intellectual seminar, it was definitely a groundbreaking release for Biztek to have organized and participated in this global issue. It is quite evident that Biztek is a keen brewer of informative issues and discussions and is a dominant organizer of such seminars.

- FACILITATING THE EVER-GROWING ADMISSIONS

Like every semester, fall semester 2010 saw a rush of prospective students interested in taking admission at Biztek. The aptitude test for fall 2010 invited a generous amount of students and was held in the lawns of Biztek on 21st August 2010. Educational institutions practice a formal procedure of attracting a pool of students for their upcoming enrollments of new semester. Biztek too has a similar ritual when admissions are open; campaigns are on full throttle to magnetize students from all parts of the city.



Students carrying all kinds of educational experience are summoned to take part in the formal proceedings of obtaining admission at our Institute. To promote higher education at professional level students are encouraged to pursue their studies further by applying to different acclaimed universities. All universities possess a common ritual beginning with an aptitude test, followed by an interview.



The aptitude comprises of a string of complex questions in form of MCQs. This is formulated by the close collaboration of the examination and admission depts. Biztek exercises stringent and meticulous instructions when it comes to rules, regulations and code of conduct. It is intolerable that prospective students or current students violate these parameters, if done so severe actions will be taken against them. During the aptitude test strict management is observed. Biztek's own staff members are urged to take aptitude if applying for a seat.

Every season we see a new batch of students approaching the Institute keen to take admissions. Apart from this

we are actively involved in imparting education and career options through our campaigns. Awareness is greatly created for students who probably have limited access to information on education alternatives. This fall a similar atmosphere was experienced as students lined up with their admit cards and were guided to their respective lawns. A formal welcome was voiced out by Ms. Saira in which precise instructions were provided on how to conduct the test. Students were provided with stationary, answer sheets and question papers which weren't allowed to turn over until as instructed.



The aptitude test times up to approximately 90 minutes and has 3 sections to attend to. Each section has its specific duration and once the duration has ended, students aren't allowed to go back to those sections. We are



specific duration and once the duration has ended, students aren't allowed to go back to those sections. We are obliged to pick out the cream students for admission reason being the test is quiet challenging and demanding. In an instance element such as time management, pressure handling and intellectual quickness are judged. This precise duration doesn't allow students to make peaks or perform cheating. Further monitoring and assessment is performed by the invigilators who walk up and down the lanes. Thus providing a quiet and serene environment for students to concentrate and attentively complete their tests.

Once the aptitude test is conducted the next step is to filter the best students who have qualified for the next round. Quality standards and eligibility criteria derive the qualified students who are than interviewed for further filtering. After checking all papers, two lists are displayed called merit list and waiting list. For the merit list students, interview sessions are conducted to view their personalities, body language and communication abilities. Our interview panel is amongst individuals who are professional and are from all walks of life. The interview panel comprises of Deans of respective field, head of admissions, and head of academics.

We congratulate and welcome students who successfully made it. Prospective students are thoroughly and wisely guided throughout the process thus making it less intimidating and astonishing. Students are even provided with sample aptitude tests so that they can prepare for the aptitude beforehand. We take pride in the fact that Biztek has always served in the purpose of imparting education to young individuals.



Choosing a field of study that is not really suited to your interests or skills could prove disastrous. And that's where career counseling comes in. Career counseling helps students discover their true potential and interest in various subjects in order to help them choose the right career. There are several institutes, including schools and colleges, today offer career counseling through a series of aptitude and IQ tests. The tests usually have multiple-choice questions, which don't need to be prepared for in any way.

The next step includes a face-to-face interview with a career guidance counselor. The interview provides the student with the opportunity to clear any doubts or queries he/ she may have regarding career options and educational courses. It also allows the counselor to further judge the aptitude of the student, thus building on the preliminary results of the written tests. In light of its importance, Biztek took the wise initiative on 6th July 2010 to launch an official department called CCPD (Career Counseling, & Placement Division). This department would be responsible for:

- Career Counseling.
- Soliciting for internships/apprenticeships with national/multinational/government/non-government/autonomous bodies on regular basis.
- Solicit for job opportunities through corporate liaison.
- Provide in-house trainings to students for resume-writing, interview techniques, personal grooming, etc.
- Maintaining student data-base and/or resume data-base in order to match the best job available.
- Arranging Career Counseling sessions for various schools/colleges

While interacting with students it was noted that they are highly dependent upon personal referrals when it comes to internship placements and not much help is being provided by the institute. Hence, it was suggested that a Career Counseling and Placement Department should be present for the institute which will work in liaison with national/multinational/government/non-government agencies for exploring opportunities for internships for the graduating students. radios manufactured for customer use interoperate from vendor to vendor. The primary advantages of the WiMAX standard are to enable the adoption of advanced radio features in a uniform fashion and reduce costs for all of the radios made by companies.

The WIMAX Forum is an industry-led, not-for-profit organization formed to certify and promote the compatibility and interoperability of broadband wireless products based upon the harmonized IEEE 802.16/ETSI HiperMAN standard. One of the WiMAX Forum's goals is to accelerate the introduction of these systems into the marketplace. The workshop also provided an inside view into what the forum is all about. It basically is the support platform for all WIMAX products available to customers worldwide.

The WiMAX Forum works closely with service providers and regulators to ensure that WiMAX Forum Certified systems meet customer and government requirements. The Forum therefore, helps bridge the gap between the technicality of products and the simple requirements of customers along with legality compulsion of which are inaccessible. They also introduced techniques which can boost the capacity and quality of networks. Further, they also enlightened students upon the need of sound and clear networks with no disturbance for information to be lucid. Later on. the workshop also informed students about GSM based mobile systems and how they are benefiting our society today. A further description was provided on the basic need and functions of electromagnetism. It is quite amazing how technology can bring in new gadgets and gizmos through introduction of never before known systems and applications which can bring wonders to us. The overall experience of the workshop was guiet insightful and allowed students to broaden their spectrum in regards to technology and its many perspectives.
