In compliance with the Sindh Govt. directives under the COVID-19 global pandemic scenario, Ilma University closed its main campus and shifted to the virtual educational platforms early last year. The University launched its online classes that were conducted according to the routine time table. The main campus had the facility with the leading-edge technology to hold these virtual classes. The faculty was thereby instructed to come and take these online sessions as per their class schedule.

Instructions to sign up and operate these online classes smoothly with a decorum were sent to the students. The faculty also recorded video lectures in the media labs for uploading on the University's channels for effective learning outcomes and student outreach.

As far as proper SOP compliance was concerned, the purpose-built university already had the facilitative infrastructure with separate well-equipped rooms allotted to

each faculty member. There were multiple computer and media labs which allowed easy maintenance of distance and usage of individually assigned systems. Hence, no contact and social distancing were ensured at all costs.

DISTANCE LEARNING AGREEMENT WITH COURSERA

Ima University collaborated with the biggest Online free course provider COURSERA which emailed them about their COVID response initiative. It offered free courses to the universities registered with them and those affected by the COVID. It would offer more than 300 courses free of cost. COURSERA responded to the University's emails, conducted a couple of zoom meetings and signed a distance learning agreement whereby they had given 5000 free licences for the students and faculty. More than 250 students and faculty were registered in more than 600 courses. Both faculty and students actively completed their courses with COURSERA online.

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

It was a great achievement that the Journal of Media & Communication and Journal of Information & Communication Technology was duly recognised by HEC in the Y category and now available at HARS.





Research & Development



It was indeed remarkable to note that ILMA had made much progress in the Research and Development category. The University had produced and published high-end research is widely acclaimed journals. The notable faculty and scholars were at the forefront of research on trending topics that were quite pertinent in diminishing the academia-industry gap.

The research publications of the Year 2020 were focused on attaining the United Nation's Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). These research papers actively propounded, discussed, debated and presented findings that moved towards viable solutions. There were rich contributions towards the diverse fields of study with extensive outreach and high impact factor.

A sweeping total of 112 publications were published in the research and development domain from the four multidisciplinary faculties. A major number of 89 publications was produced from the Faculty of Management Sciences, followed by 20 from Faculties of Computer Science & Science & Technology and last of all 3 from Faculty of Media & Design. In the leading Faculty, 21 fell in Category W, 9 in Category X and 42 in Category Y. In the combined Faculties 6 came in Category W, 9 in Category X and 3 in Category Y. Last but not the least in the Faculty of Media & Design only 3 entered the Category Y.

These papers were published in world-renowned journals which included Journal of Innovation, Creativity and Change, IEEE Network, Technology Forecasting and Change, International Journal of Environmental Research & Public Health, Journal of Cleaner Production, International Journal of Image & Data Fusion, International Journal of Science & Economics, International Journal of Healthcare Management, China Economic Journal, Habibia Islamicus, International Journal of Academic Management Science Research and Journal of Culture Society and Development among notable others. This large volume of publications showed that ILMA had made incredible strides in this research fields with their exceptional and expert scholars leading the way.





INTEREST-FREE MICRO FINANCE LOANS

In order to encourage small-level business RCKS and AFMF provide interest-free loans to the deserving families. The process is managed through application and verification process and then only loan is disbursed.

Till today total 13 families have received loans on easy payback terms. These families utilized the loans in setting up small grocery shops, purchasing sewing machines, rickshaw, bike rider service, food service to name a few.

These micro-finance-loans brought positive change in the people's lives and provided them opportunity to come out of welfare cycle and do something for themselves.













WATER SOLUTIONS

One more thing for which RCKS and AFMF has interest is the water solutions for the people who are deprived of easy access of drinking water. The team has installed several hand pumps in the lower Punjab region where water access was issue for remote villages.

Further, the team is installing hand pumps, small and big, in the Tharparkar and Umerkot districts of Sind which face challenges in access to clean drinking water. We have till now installed 10 pumps in this region and continues to install new hand pumps regularly.

WINTER CLOTHES DISTRIBUTION

As winters are harsh in the rural areas, therefore, RCKS and AFMF jointly distributed winter clothes in the winter season to the deprived population.

3 such distributions campaigns were held in the areas of Mirpur sakro, Sakran (Hub) and Dadu district during which winter clothes were distributed to thousands of people.

DAILY IFTAR IN THE MONTH OF RAMADAN

In the holy month of Ramadan, RCKS and AFMF arranged a daily iftar drive for the whole month. Daily more than 100 people break their fast and do iftar at the RCKS and AFMF facility in the Korangi Industrial Area.

For Sadqa-e-Jariah purposes, RCKS and AFMF supported several masjids in their renovation works. Also equipment related to water, sound, lighting and fans were also provided to several masjids during the period.
