Edito

The first issue of 2008 is here highlighting a number of 2007 Biztek graduates and the impressive next steps they have planned for their lives. Read news of faculty and students, campus activities, and athletic accomplishments - as well as updates and news from alumni.

When it comes to the private benefits of higher education, possibly even more important is how advanced intellectual abilities help people navigate contemporary life. We have to do so many things that other people used to do for us, from making our own breakfasts to making choices about our health to planning for our jobs in future. We have to be able to hop from job to job without loss of momentum as we acquire new skills and knowledge. We have to deal with a wider variety of people in this country and in an increasingly shrinking world.

People from the previous generations, having no collegiate ambitions for themselves, are very ambitious for their children and are determined that they will go to college. But when it comes to a noticeable difference between those parents, they can't help their kids with the content; neither have they known that they need to really push the child to do his homework for a certain amount of time after school every day.

I thought of this fact when I opened a research paper, which shows the correlation between parental education and children's grades. Sure enough, the more highly educated the parents, the higher the grades of their children: 60.6 percent of children whose parents have advanced degrees get mostly A's, whereas only 27.8 percent of high-school dropouts' children do. That differential comes about in numerous small, intangible ways. For instance, educated parents use a wider vocabulary in speaking to their infants than their less-educated counterparts do. Children of educated mothers are also almost twice as likely to be read to as those with less-educated mothers. They are also apt to participate in sustained conversations, even debates, which help inestimably when it comes to writing papers in school and college.

With their sense of entitlement, more highly educated parents are more likely to fight for their children in school, and they know what privileges to fight for. Having been through the system, they are more knowledgeable about its twists and turns and better able to help their children navigate them. Parents' involvement has a remarkably good effect on their children's engagement and satisfaction with college, and hence on their ultimate success.

In short, a college education has benefits that ripple down through the generations. Children inherit not just the "sins of the fathers" but their privileges. In this country we've prided ourselves on a system of education by which we arbitrate opportunity and expand merit-based success without surrendering individual responsibility. But with college-going rates stagnating, completion rates a disgrace, and income gaps widening, we are becoming a bounded society as any in the Old World.

The children of the less educated will be an increasingly large proportion of the college-going pool. Their parents are equally, if not more, determined to see them succeed than those for whom college is a family tradition, but they can't help them adequately. We need to do for those children what our parents did for us-smooth the way for them to get into college, and once they're there, make sure that they have the same kinds of experiences that help more-privileged students succeed. These students are less likely than the average student to participate in collegiate activities that lead to student success (learning communities, research with faculty members, study in groups, or capstone experiences).

Bottom-line! Cherish the privileges of higher education which many in your country can not even benefit from.














Cricket Tournament:

Mr. Fahad Khan explained the importance of the skills individual should posses to cope with the challanging environment of the today's modern era. The term innovation may refer to both radical and incremental changes in thinking, in things, in processes or in services. Invention that gets out in to the world is innovation. Innovation is an important topic in the study of

economics, business, technology, sociology, and engineering. Colloquially, the word "innovation" is often used as synonymous with the output of the process.

He said that in the organisational context, innovation may be linked to performance and growth through improvements in efficiency, productivity, quality, competitive positioning, market share, etc.

While innovation typically adds value, innovation may also have a negative or destructive effect as new developments clear away or change old organisational forms and practices. Organisations that do not innovate effectively may be destroyed by those that do. Hence innovation typically involves risk. A key challenge in innovation is maintaining a balance between process and product innovations, where process innovations tend to involve a business model which may develop shareholder satisfaction through improved efficiencies while product innovations develop customer support





Innovation in organizations

A convenient definition of innovation from an organizational perspective is given by Luecke and Katz;

"Innovation . . . is generally understood as the successful introduction of a new thing or method . . . Innovation is the embodiment, combination, or synthesis of knowledge in original, relevant, valued new products, processes, or services.

Innovation typically involves creativity, but is not identical to it: innovation involves acting on the creative ideas to make some specific and tangible difference in the domain in which the innovation occurs.

A further characterization of innovation is as an organizational or management process. For example, Davila et al (2006), writes:



"Innovation, like many business functions, is a management process that requires specific tools, rules, and discipline." He said that, from his point of view the emphasis is moving from the introduction of specific novel and useful ideas to the general organizational processes and procedures for generating, considering, and acting on such insights leading to significant organizational improvements in terms of improved or new business products, services, or internal processes.

He spoke about the entry level, how should a candidate enter into the organization. In this regard, he explained the skills required in designing the CV of an individual, while the candidate had not met with the interviewer.



Dr. Muhammad Ali Siddiqui, in his closing remarks he applauded the skills of the guest speaker and thanked him.

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



"Role of ATM 1 Linkin Pakistan"

Institute of Business and Technology (BIZTEK) organized a seminar on Role of ATM 1 in Pakistan on 20th Sep, 2007 at its Korangi Campus. Asynchronous Transfer Mode is one of the most emerging protocols currently used across the world. This Protocol is one of the most emerging technologies, in which a logical connection is established between the two endpoints before the actual data exchange begins. ATM has been proved very successful in the WAN scenario and numerous telecommunication providers have implemented ATM in their wide area network cores. ATM has failed to gain wide use as a LAN technology, and its complexity has held back its full deployment as the single integrating network technology.

The Speaker Mr. Talat Hussain, Country Manager of ABN Amro bank presented very extensive speech on ATM 1 Link. Duration of entire presentation was one hour. All the audience enthusiastically took part continuously in the 30 minutes question/answer session.

This was arranged by our concerned faculty. By visiting there we got ample knowledge regarding NGO working life.

HOPE (Health Oriented Preventive Education) is a NGO (non-governmental organization) based in Karachi, Pakistan working towards Community Development, comprising of professionals (Doctors, Social workers, Educationists) as well as grass-root workers. The ultimate aim of HOPE is Community Development

through self-sufficiency of the community. The members of HOPE are working side by side with community volunteers and organize them in Community Based Organizations (CBO'S).



Dr. Mubina Agboatwalla, visionary behind HOPE, founded the NGO in 1997 with a group of dedicated workers committed to bringing literacy and health to the neglected urban slums of Karachi while working at the grassroots level. Under her direction, HOPE has established two community centers, two hospitals and several informal schools in Karachi and Thatta. Dr. Mubina Agboatwalla is Assistant Professor, Dept. of Community Health Sciences, at the Aga Khan University Hospital besides working as Consultant pediatrician in various Karachi Hospitals. She is a well-known Researcher and has contributed to numerous Indexed international medical journals. She also writes for various national newspapers including Dawn, Jang etc.

ACTIVITIES & ACHIEVEMENTS OF HOPE

Hope Community Center Assistance of Japan:

A multi purpose HOPE Community Center is constructed in Zia colony, Korangi with assistance from the Japanese Embassy Grass Root Assistance (GRA) programme.

Education

To fight illiteracy, ten Home - Schools have been established by HOPE in Manzoor Colony, Mujahid Colony and Bilal Colony.

Library projects

It is extremely important to develop reading habits amongst children, youth and adults. For this propose a small Library has been set up in the Community Centre of Mujahid Colony and Manzoor Colony.

Measles surveillance program

Measles is the leading cause of morbidity and mortality in children under 5 years of age. HOPE in collaboration with UNICEF started a Project on Measles Surveillance in 1998 and 1999.

MCH Center

Nearly half of our population comprises of females. Maternal Mortality is extremely high in Pakistan. This is chiefly due to Pregnancy related complications. Maternal and Child health Centers have been established both in Manzoor Colony and Mujahid Colony where Ante - natal care is provided to the mothers.

Nutrition

In Pakistan, nearly 40% of children and women are malnourished. HOPE through its network is working on various aspects of Nutrition. This includes Growth monitoring through the HOPE clinics, dietary management, trials with local nutritious diet.

Visit to HOPE transpired us that it is not possible for the government to provide all amenities to the people; it is also only possible where all segments of the society, including private public partnership may join hands for the welfare of common man.

Cricket and basketball tournament was planned in the last two days by Salman Nosherwani. All the boys enjoyed the heat and the winning team was awarded with shields.





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
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
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
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
